#### Early Childhood Education (Pre-K – 3) (Path Leads to a General A.S.T. Degree)

Prerequisites may apply to specific courses; it is the student's responsibility to determine if prerequisites have been met. Prior to registering each semester, the student is expected to consult with his/her advisor.

## **Additional Degree Requirements**

- Students transferring to a UT or TBR university *may* need to meet additional requirements to gain admittance to the university's early childhood program. Transferring students must check with the intended university for specific program requirements.
- In general, transferring students must meet the following:
  - Attainment of 2.75 cumulative grade point average
  - Successful completion of approved standardized examination for admission to university Colleges of Education
  - Satisfactory rating on an index of suitability for the teaching profession (procedure will be developed through collaboration between university and community college representatives)

## **Tennessee Transfer Pathways**

Tennessee Transfer Pathways constitute agreements between community colleges and four-year colleges and universities confirming that community college courses meet major preparation requirements and guaranteeing that all community college courses taken will be accepted at the Tennessee college/university and will count toward completion of the specific major. The following Tennessee public universities offer programs to complete these Pathways: Tennessee State University and Tennessee Technological University, and University of Tennessee at Knoxville.
