<sup>3</sup>MATH Enrollment in MATH 1830 requires completion of high school algebra 1 and algebra 2 and precalculus and an ACT math score of at least 22 and an ACT reading score of at least 19 or equivalent math and reading scores or MATH 1130 or MATH 1710 or MATH 1730. Enrollment in MATH 1630 requires completion of high school algebra 1 and algebra 2 and precalculus and ACT math score of at least 22 and an ACT reading score

of at least 19 or equivalent math and reading scores or MATH 1130 or MATH 1710 or MATH 1720 or MATH 1730.

<sup>8</sup>GE Chosen from any unduplicated transferable course. Students planning to transfer must check course equivalency tables and/or catalogs of the intended college or university.

## **Additional Information Regarding Foreign Language**

At some universities, foreign language may be required in certain programs that lead to the bachelor of science degree. Complete information regarding foreign language requirements at each university is on the transfer and articulation websites of the Tennessee Board of Regents and the University of Tennessee System. Community college students are encouraged to be familiar with foreign language requirements at the universities and, if applicable, complete the requirements before transferring.

## **Tennessee Transfer Pathways**

Tennessee Transfer Pathways constitute agreements between community colleges and four-year colleges and universities confirming that community college courses meet major preparation requirements and guaranteeing that all community college courses taken will be accepted at the Tennessee college/university and will count toward completion of the specific major. The following Tennessee public universities offer programs to complete these Pathways: Austin Peay State University, East Tennessee State University, Middle Tennessee State University, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University, University of Memphis, and University of Tennessee at Martin.
