Enrollment in MATH 1910 requires completion of high school algebra 1 and algebra 2 and geometry and

precalculus/trigonometry and an ACT math score of at least 26 and an ACT reading score of at least 19 or equivalent math and reading scores or MATH 1710 and 1720 or MATH 1730.

Additional Information Regarding Foreign Language

At some universities, foreign language may be required in certain programs that lead to the bachelor of science degree. Community college students are encouraged to be familiar with foreign language requirements at the universities and, if applicable, complete the requirements before transferring.

Tennessee Transfer Pathways

Tennessee Transfer Pathways constitute agreements between community colleges and four-year colleges and universities confirming that community college courses meet major preparation requirements and guaranteeing that all community college courses taken will be accepted at the Tennessee college/university and will count toward completion of the specific major. The following Tennessee public universities offer programs to complete these Pathways: East Tennessee State University, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University, University of Memphis, and University of Tennessee at Martin.
