⁴MATH MATH 2050 is required for transfer to UTK.

⁵MATH MATH 1830 is required for transfer to ETSU and UTK. Enrollment in MATH 1830 requires completion of high school algebra 1 and algebra 2 and precalculus

and an ACT math score of at least 22 and an ACT reading score of at least 19 or equivalent math and reading scores or MATH 1130 or MATH 1710 or MATH 1730 with a grade of C or better. MATH 1830 is NOT required at the University of Memphis.

⁶GE Chosen from any unduplicated transferable course. Students planning to transfer must check course equivalency tables and/or catalogs of the intended college or university.

⁷ENGL Chosen from ENGL 2035, 2055, 2110, 2120, 2150, 2210, 2220, 2310, 2320, 2510, 2520.
