Courses and Course Sequence

This sequence can be followed by students who begin college-level work in the fall semester. Prerequisites may apply to specific courses; it is the student's responsibility to determine if prerequisites have been met. Prior to registering each semester, the student is expected to consult with his/her advisor. **This pathway is designed for transfer as an Economics major, B.S., B.B.A., or B.S.B.A. degrees, in any public university in Tennessee, including the College of Business at the University of Tennessee Knoxville, in the College of Liberal Arts at Middle Tennessee State University, and in the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Tennessee Chattanooga.**

²MATH Enrollment in MATH 1830 requires completion of high school algebra 1 and algebra 2 and precalculus and an ACT math score of at least 22 and an ACT reading score of at least 19 or equivalent math and reading scores or MATH 1130 or MATH 1710 or MATH 1730 with a grade of C or better. MATH 1830 is required for transfer to ETSU, UTK, University of Memphis, UTC, TSU, and TTU. MATH 1830 is NOT required for transfer to UT Martin, APSU and MTSU.

³GE Chosen from any transferable course. Students planning to transfer must check course equivalency tables and/or catalogs of the intended college or university.

⁴NS Chosen from BIOL 1110, 1120, 2010, 2020, 2310, 2320; CHEM 1010, 1020, 1050, 1110, 1120; GEOL 1040, 1050, 1300; PHYS 1070, 2010, 2020, 2110, 2120.

⁵MATH Enrollment in MATH 1630 requires completion of high school algebra 1 and algebra 2 and precalculus and ACT math score of at least 22 and an ACT reading score of at least 19 or equivalent math and reading scores or MATH 1130 or MATH 1710 or MATH 1720 or MATH 1730. MATH 1630 is required for transfer to APSU, ETSU, MTSU, TSU, and UTK. MATH 1130 is required for transfer to TTU, University of Memphis, UTC, and UT Martin.

⁶ENGL Chosen from ENGL 2035, 2055, 2110, 2120, 2150, 2210, 2220, 2310, 2320, 2510, 2520.

Tennessee Transfer Pathways

Tennessee Transfer Pathways constitute agreements between community colleges and four-year colleges and universities confirming that community college courses meet major preparation requirements and guaranteeing that all community college courses taken will be accepted at the Tennessee college/university and will count toward completion of the specific major. This pathway is designed for transfer as an Economics major, B.S., B.B.A., or B.S.B.A. degrees, at any public university in Tennessee, including the College of Business at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.
