³FREN/GERM/SPAN Two intermediate foreign language courses are required to transfer to UTK. Students lacking two years of study in the same foreign language must

complete one year of beginning foreign language prior to enrolling in intermediate courses.

⁴PHIL Chosen from PHIL 1030, 1040, 1300, 1500, 2200.

⁵PHYS Chosen from GEOL 1040, GEOL 1050, GEOL 1300, PHYS 1070, PHYS 2010, PHYS 2020, PHYS 2110, PHYS 2120.

⁶GE Chosen from any unduplicated transferable course. Students planning to transfer must check course equivalency tables and/or catalogs of the intended college or university.

Additional Degree Requirements

These courses are to prepare candidates for SE Interventionist K-8 and SPED Comprehensive K-12 licensure programs. Students transferring to a UT or TBR university *may* need to meet additional requirements to gain admittance to that university's Special Education program. Transferring students must check with that university for specific program requirements. Students transferring to UTK *need* to be formally admitted to the program during semester 4.

Tennessee Transfer Pathways

Tennessee Transfer Pathways constitute agreements between community colleges and four-year colleges and universities confirming that community college courses meet major preparation requirements and guaranteeing that all community college courses taken will be accepted at the Tennessee college/university and will count toward completion of the specific major. The following Tennessee public universities offer programs to complete these Pathways: Austin Peay State University, East Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University, University of Memphis, University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, and University of Tennessee at Martin.
