

COURSES REQUIRED FOR ROANE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE NURSING PROGRAM (AAS in Nursing)

Students completing these courses will meet the minimum course requirements for admission into the Roane State Community College Associate of Applied Science in Nursing Program.

Twelve hours of General Education courses (including mathematics) must be completed prior to the application deadline. Students under 21 years old with an ACT score of 20 or higher may apply sooner if they have completed their math requirement with a C or better. Note that students with more credits completed are given higher priority toward admission. Students should complete as many science courses as possible before applying, as high science grades improve chance of acceptance.

Completion of these courses does not guarantee admission into RSCC's Nursing Program. An application for admission into the RSCC Nursing Program must be submitted and the student must be accepted. Acceptance is substantially improved by earning a high GPA in the required courses, by completing science courses prior to applying, and by earning high grades in the science courses.

Students must apply to both the college and to the nursing school. Students should check with the college and the nursing school to determine application deadlines, which may be well in advance of the entrance dates.

Note that course requirements may change. It is the student's responsibility to check with the RSCC Nursing Program to make sure all courses will transfer and are acceptable. This is especially true if the courses were taken at other colleges or universities. See the RSCC Catalog for more information on admission requirements for the college and for the Nursing Program.

Completion of these courses does not result in an AS degree from PSTCC. Additional courses are required; see your PSTCC advisor for more information.
