**East Tennessee State University**

- The Bachelor of General Studies (BGS) provides adult students with an alternative to traditional degree programs. It is intended for the mature student, age 21 or older, who wishes to complete an undergraduate degree while still maintaining employment and family responsibilities.
- Students must meet ETSU Admissions requirements and must also apply for admission to the BGS program and be formally admitted to the program.
- Working with a BGS academic advisor, the student will develop an individualized program of study (course sequence) for the junior and senior year that is specially tailored to the student's learning needs.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours required for graduation/receipt of the Baccalaureate degree.
- Computer proficiency is required.
- BGSD 4210 required in senior year.

Transfer students with 50 or more transferable hours are required to take half the intensive requirements of native students. Therefore, you will need two writing (W), one oral communication (O), and one using information technology (T) intensive courses. You must take these courses at ETSU; transfer credit does not satisfy the intensive requirements. **NOTE: Intensive courses are built into ETSU program requirements. They are not additional hours.**
