\*In the Spring of their third year, students normally make the decision to enter the job market upon graduation or apply to the Master of Accountancy program. Students planning to enter the MAcc program should take ACC 414 or ACC 431 for Information Management 442 in the Information Management collateral, or for Logistics 421 in the Logistics collateral; for Finance 455 in the Finance collateral; and for Management 471 in the International Business Collateral. Accounting 414 and 431 are both prerequisites to the MAcc program.

**TRANSFER AGREEMENT OPTION:** Students who do NOT wish to graduate from PSTCC but who still want to complete UTK pre-major requirements for business should satisfy the following:

- A. Complete the intermediate foreign language sequence at PSTCC (currently listed in the junior year). Students will take 6 hours of electives at UTK in place of the foreign language to meet the minimum 60 hours required at a 4-year institution.
- B. Complete one course in Western or World Civilization (instead of a sequence).
- C. Complete one humanities/arts elective (instead of two).

**NOTE:** Only in exceptional cases will an application for transfer students be considered after 75 hours of coursework have been attempted.
