TRANSFER AGREEMENT OPTION: Students who do NOT wish to graduate from PSTCC but who still want to complete UTK pre-major requirements for business should satisfy the following:

- A. Complete the intermediate foreign language sequence at PSTCC (currently listed in the junior year). Students will take 6 hours of electives at UTK in place of the foreign language to meet the minimum 60 hours required at a 4-year institution.
- B. Complete one course in Western or World Civilization (instead of a sequence).
- C. Complete one humanities/arts elective (instead of two).

NOTE: Only in exceptional cases will an application for transfer students be considered after 75 hours of coursework have been attempted.
