¹Enrollment in MATH 1630 requires completion of MATH 1130 or an ACT math score of at least 21 and completion of precalculus. Enrollment in MATH 1830 requires completion of MATH 1130 or an ACT math score of at least 23 and completion of precalculus. (Note: MATH 1630 does not prepare a student for MATH 1830.) Enrollment in MATH 1910-1920 requires completion of MATH 1730 or an ACT math score of 26 and completion of precalculus, geometry, and trigonometry.

²Select two courses from: BIOL 1110, 1120; BOT 1010, 1020; CHEM 1010, 1020, 1110, 1120; GEOL 1040, 1050, 1300; PHYS 2010, 2020, 2110, 2120.

³Students lacking two years of study in the same foreign language at the high school level will take the prerequisite to this sequence: one year of beginning foreign language.

⁴Select one course from: ART 1720, 1730; ENGL 2110, 2120, 2210, 2220, 2310, 2320, 2331, 2510, 2520; MUS 1030; PHIL 1030; THEA 1030.

⁵Select one course from: HIST 1010, 1020, 1110, 1120.

⁶Select nine hours from one area: Finance - FIN 425, 435, and 455*; Information Management - IM 342, 442*, 443; Logistics - LOG 310, 411, 421*; International Business - Select three from IB 409, 419, 429, 439, 449, 459, or BA 400*; and IB 489**.

*In the spring of their third year, students normally make the decision whether to enter the job market upon graduation or apply to the Master of Accountancy program. ACC 414 and 431 are both prerequisites to the MAcc program; therefore, students planning to enter the MAcc program should take ACC 414 or ACC 431 (whichever was not taken to satisfy the major requirement) instead of IM 442 in the Information Management Collateral, LOG 421 in the Logistics Collateral, FIN 455 in the Finance Collateral, and one of the three required courses in the International Business Collateral.

**Students pursuing the international business collateral will be required to complete a study abroad experience approved by the College of Business Administration Undergraduate Programs Office and represented by enrollment in International Business 489.

NOTE: Only in exceptional cases will an application for transfer students be considered after 75 hours of coursework have been attempted.
