Media Center is an application that you can download and install on your personal computer at no cost. It is not required to use **eAudiobooks**, but it makes them easier and more fun to use.

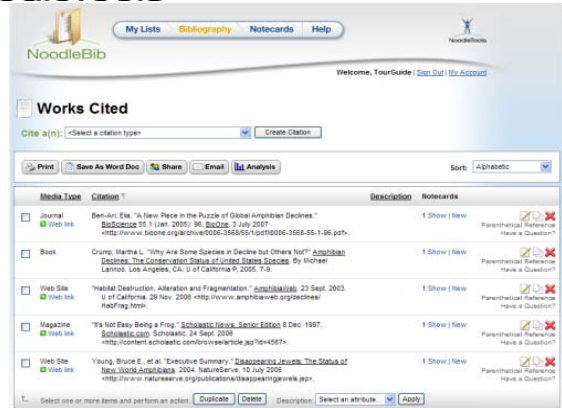
- Browse and search your library's **eAudiobook** collection.

- It also shows you when your portable device is connected and ready to receive eAudiobook files.

Is My Book Overdue?

Beginning Spring semester 2009, Library Services will email overdue notices for library materials kept past the due date. Sending notices via email will allow the library to save both paper and postage.



First and second level overdue notices will be delivered to your Pellissippi State email account. **Third notices and bills** for materials not returned after 30 days will continue to be mailed to your address on file in paper-format.

New Books! The Library posts a list of newly purchased books each month. To view a complete list of new books purchased lately, visit the Library's home page <http://www.pstcc.edu/library> . Once there, select the **What's New** link in the **Quick Links** area on the right of the page. You may also visit the Pellissippi campus Library to peruse the **New Books** shelf near the Reference Desk.

If you are at a satellite campus and want to check out that new book, go to the **Online Catalog**, find the book title, print out the title record page, and bring it to the ERC circulation desk. We will request the book from the appropriate Library/ERC. In most cases, the material will arrive in 1-2 business days!
