Geography Reference Center

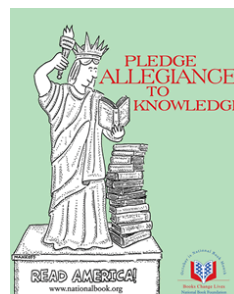

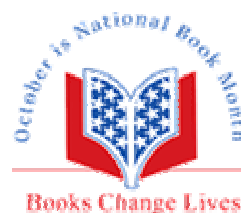
