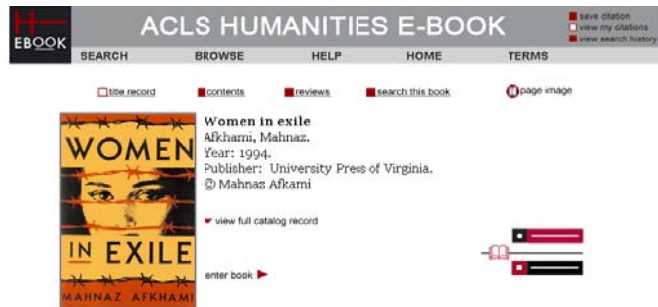


March 2008 - What's New at the Library?

Humanities E-Book is a digital collection of over 1500 full-text titles offered by the ACLS in collaboration with twelve learned societies, nearly 90 contributing publishers, and librarians at the University of Michigan's Scholarly Publishing Office.

The result is an online, fully searchable collection of high-quality books in the Humanities, recommended and reviewed by scholars and featuring unlimited multi-user access and free, downloadable MARC records. HEB is available 24/7 on- and off-campus through standard web browsers. Some interesting titles:

Answer: Can you name 3 famous librarians?

- **Casanova (1725-1798)** Famous womanizer served 13 years as librarian for the Count von Waldstein in the chateau of Dux in Bohemia.
- **Mao Tse-Tung (1893-1976)** worked as an assistant to the chief librarian of the University of Peking. Overlooked for advancement, he decided to get ahead in another field and eventually became chairman of the Chinese Communist Party.
- **FBI Head J. Edgar Hoover (1895-1972)** was a Library of Congress messenger and cataloguer in his first job.
