Complete PAWS, including career assessment then schedule an appointment with career counselor for an in-depth self-exploration

Explore and choose an academic focus area; meet with your academic advisor to align academic courses with career path

Begin building professional network; talk with faculty, alumni and others about careers; actively participate in student organizations/events (including Involvement Fair)

Volunteer, find work-based learning opportunities (including job shadowing) related to your degree

Find and bookmark Career Services webpage and resources, including skills that employers seek in job candidates

31-45 CREDIT HOURS

Attend Transfer Fairs; Connect with representatives from chosen transfer institutions and work with them on an ongoing basis; Review and finalize transfer plans; apply for scholarships

Research jobs/companies/industries; gather information on realistic salary expectations

Update resume, references, letters of recommendation, create LinkedIn profile; clean up online presence

Gain experience in your degree area – volunteer, shadow professionals in jobs related to degree, part-time jobs, etc.

Develop and practice elevator pitch; continue informational interviews with employers

Maintain and grow professional network

46-60 CREDIT HOURS

Finalize plans for transfer to 4-year institution; complete graduation steps

Talk with professors and other mentors about being references and/or writing recommendation letters in the future

Develop employer prospect list; pursue part-time employment, internships, and/or other experiential opportunities related to your field of study

Learn how to develop a professional quality resume; refine elevator pitch

Research 'dress for success' strategies in your field of study
